



Gujarat Law Society's HACC is among the rare grant-in-aid colleges to have the privilege of hosting both, the Ellisbridge South Zone and the Inter-Zonal youth festivals of Gujarat University, in the month of September this year. Aptly titled Prajwalan 2018, the tag-line of the events – "Igniting Talent" – indicated exactly what the Youth Festival is all about.

The Ellisbridge South Zone Youth Festival of Gujarat University was held from 12th to 15th September 2018. With 45 colleges participating in 29 different events, this is the largest zone of Gujarat University, recording a staggering 1500 plus number of participants!

The Principal of the college led the organization of the events forward, with coordinators and joint-coordinators. At the Ellisbridge South Zone level, Dr. Mahesh Sonara and Prof. Malti Vala were the coordinators. At the Inter-Zonal level, Dr. Chetan Mewada and Prof. Nikhil Vaidya were the coordinators.

The team spirit of HACC was evident in the way the entire staff and the committed volunteers worked towards organizing these events under the leadership of Principal Dr. Sanjay Vakil.

AWARENESS PROGRAMMES

World Cancer Day

The college organized a talk on the occasion of World Cancer Day to spread the awareness about the disease. Prin. Dr. Sanjay Vakil addressed the students and informed them about the different ways in which the disease could enter the body. He also made the students take a pledge to keep away from addictions and habits that could cause cancer.

Pledge to Vote

The college students were led on a pledge to vote during the upcoming elections in the country, and to uphold the values of democracy. The pledge-taking ceremony was led by the Principal and the authority from the University, thus creating an awareness of the importance of the Ballot.

SOCIAL OUTREACH PROGRAMMES

Awareness Drive against Drug Abuse & Illicit Trafficking:

HACC organized a 3-day drive to spread awareness among the students and the society around about the dangers of drug abuse and the presence of illicit trafficking, on the 26, 27, 28 June, 2018. This is a unique event, and no other educational institute has had such a campaign.

The drive was divided into three parts. On the first day Ms Panna Momaya, DCP. Ahmdeabad Police, and alumnus of HACC, talked to the students about the realities of drug abuse and illicit trafficking. She informed the students about the problems of the youth in particular with regards to these issues that seem to be rampant in India today.

On the second day, the students and faculty members were led by the principal to the Gulbai Tekra area wherein the spread awareness to the slum dwellers about the dangers of drug abuse and illicit trafficking. They talked to the people in the locality and showed them posters of the problems caused by these issues.

On the third day, a poster-making competition was conducted at the college on the theme of Anti Drug-Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. Students participated with enthusiasm and created art work to spread this message, thus engaging in thoughts about the dangers of these issues themselves.

Tree-Plantation Programme

The NSS unit of the college organized a tree plantation program in the campus. Prin. Dr. Sanjay Vakil talked about the importance and advantages of tree plantation. Thus, students learnt about the importance of living in harmony with the environment.

NCC Orientation Programme

MOU with Gandhian Institutions

The H. A. Gandhian Society signed an MoU with three Gandhian institutions in Gujarat: The Sabarmati Ashram, the Gandhi Ashram (Zilia) and the Environmental and Sanitation Institute (ESI). These MoU's are created to further exchange of faculty and students for the promotion and awareness of Gandhian values and philosophies.

Social Service by NSS:

The NSS unit of the college collected funds and donations in kind to raise aid for the poor and destitute. They donated these to the Mother Teresa Orphanage and the Home for the Destitute.

NSS Camp at Ropda:

The NSS unit of the college went to Ropda, a village in the Daskroi district of Gujarat, to work for the awareness and upliftment of the people there. During their 6-day stay there, the students and the faculty in-charge organized awareness programmes, street-plays, cultural programmes, quizzes, rangoli competitions, posters, cleanliness drives etc, in the village. They were led by Prin. Dr. Sanjay Vakil, Prof. Chaudhari, Prof. Vasava and Prof. Mewada in this camp. The members of the Village Panchayat and the citizens of the village appreciated the contribution of the college.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Orientation Programme:

Arts College, and a power-point presentation about the college and its functioning. GANDHI FOR ALL, GANDHI FOR ALWAYS



Introduction:

The greatest quality of Mahatma Gandhi is perhaps his capacity to reach out to citizens of one of the largest countries in the world, breaking all barriers that could exist in communication and in society. It is difficult to believe that he could do this without Google, YouTube, Facebook and WhatsApp. And yet, history is witness to the fact that he did. His vast outreach and connection with the masses makes me believe in the relevance of Gandhi for ALL and for ALWAYS.

This paper is divided into three sections:

- Gandhi and the One
- Gandhi and the Other
- Gandhi and the Many

In the first section – Gandhi and the One – the idea of Gandhi's spirituality and his connection with God will be discussed. The second section – Gandhi and the Other – will discuss the Mahatma's one-to-one interaction with people who came in contact with him personally. And in the third section – Gandhi and the Many – Gandhi Bapu as a public figure and national leader will be discussed. The paper will conclude with the reiteration of the relevance of Gandhi for all times, showing how only a man of high spirituality, deep understanding and immense compassion could only be a Mahatma. A Mahatma has no time-bound existence, because the Atma is eternal.

Gandhi and the One:

Gandhiji was a highly evolved, spiritual human being. For him, Spirituality was his most important priority. Politics, public life, independence and freedom, and social upliftment were all the by-products of his spirituality. They all emerged from his spiritual foundation. His view about God and religion was not a narrow, limited one. He says:

"True religion is not a narrow dogma. It is not external observance. It is faith in God and living in the presence of God. It means faith in a future life, in truth and Ahimsa.... Religion is a matter of the heart."

As a person progresses on the path of spirituality, his or her priorities in life change. The focus of life shifts more towards getting personal happiness through mental peace or by helping others and less on material needs, greed and desires. Gandhiji's experiments on simple and sustainable living, not only for himself but for all his fellow-citizens as well, followed his own spiritual progress. His maxim of simple living and high thinking was lived through his life only because of his intense spirituality.

The strength of his character came from this deep spirituality. As he says, "I have no strength save what God gives me. I have no authority over my countrymen save the pure moral. If He holds me to be a pure instrument for the spread of non-violence in place of the awful violence now ruling the earth, He will give me the strength and show me the way. My greatest weapon is mute prayer." It is such deep faith that is evident in the entire personality of the Mahatma. And it is through the strength of his faith in God that he could lead the country towards a non-violent and satyagrahi fight to attain independence.

Gandhi and the Other:

In phenomenology, the term "the Other" identifies another human being, a being distinct and separate from the Self. It is only in being able to identify the Other that we can know ourselves. The Other is a cumulative, complementary factor in the self-image of a person. In other words, the Other that gives us the acknowledgement of being real.

Gandhi created his own identity based on the identity of the Other. For him the Other was the ordinary Indian citizen. A British Delegate at a UN Security Meeting reportedly said that Gandhi was "the friend of the poorest, the loneliest, and the lost." Working towards India's independence, he identified with 80% of the peasant and illiterate people. His clothing, his lifestyle, his approach to those with whom he communicated, were all based on his notion of the Other. Before emerging as a national leader, Gandhi believed in establishing strong, healthy and clear relationships personally, professionally and politically. It would not be possible to mention all the instances in Gandhi's autobiography where he acted in accordance with the principle of respect for others, seeking to build a positive and peaceful relationship. On each occasion, whenever Gandhi acted, he always asked himself the same questions: Who is this person? What does he think? What is of interest to him? How can I convince and inform him?

Gandhi and the Many:

Gandhiji could move millions during India's freedom struggle as India's citizens closely identified with this simple ascetic. He towered above them all, yet he was one of them. The Gandhian technique of mobilizing people, activating them and provoking them into unified action, has been successfully used by many oppressed societies around the world under the leadership of people like Martin Luther King in the United States, Nelson Mandela in South Africa, and now Aung San Suu Kyi in Myanmar, which is a strong testimony to the continuing relevance of Mahatma Gandhi.

Not only did Gandhi lead all Indians towards independence and freedom, but he also could lead the entire world into a new mindset of satyagraha and ahimsa. Much more than preaching human

behavior and ethics, or prescribing norms of conduct, he lived the life he wanted his fellow citizens to live. India has always been a nation of many diverse nationalities, but never did they so unanimously identify with a leader as they identified with Gandhi, and this was across classes and communities which were even more sharply divided than they are these days.

Conclusion:

Gandhi's relevance today lies in his ability to connect with people beyond all boundaries. Only a person of deep spirituality, immense understanding and profound compassion can have the capacity to rise above the narrow and restrictive categories of class, caste, religion and community. In fact, his entire personality could be summed up in just one line that he wrote: "My life is my message."

Mahatma Gandhi's patriotism and nationalism were not narrow-minded or exclusive, but were part of his search for truth through unity in diversity and through service. These were expressions of his swadeshi spirit. He states: "I am patriotic because I am human and humane. It is not exclusive. I will not hurt England and Germany to serve India".


Sam Pitroda writes: "While the twenty-first century has been defined by globalisation, free markets, privatisation, liberalisation... it has also been marked by violence, extremism, inequity, poverty, and disparity. Amidst all this, if one poses the question of relevance of Gandhiji to our age, one is struck by an astounding need for him for our times. Gandhiji's ideals... and leadership hold an extremely relevant moral and social mirror to our society." In our times and for our society, Gandhi's compassion, values and strength of character are, and have been, incomparable.

It is extremely significant that Gandhi was given the title of Mahatma. In a sense, "Mahatma" is an elevated state of the mind that can be achieved with the right thoughts and actions. And Gandhi represented this elevated state of mind. Mahatma is also a great, enlightened soul. The Atma, or the Soul, is eternal. An enlightened soul is even more so. And so are the values and philosophies of Mahatma Gandhi. Hence, the title of this paper – Gandhi for All, Gandhi for Always.

The country is a Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic Republic with a parliamentary system of government. Though India has shown tremendous growth in all spheres of national life in the years after independence, yet many problems plague the everyday social life; the problems, many a time, are interrelated.

Poverty, Population, Pollution, Illiteracy, Corruption, Inequality, Gender discrimination, Terrorism, Communalism, Lack of Infrastructure, Unemployment, Regionalism, Casteism, Alcoholism, Drugs Abuse, Violence against Women are the major social problems of India.

To understand social problems, sociologists look “from outside” at individuals rather than looking them “from inside”, to examine the thoughts, cause, and action. This is due to the fact that for the sociologist, many problems that appear as personal are actually social problems, because personal experience in one way or another is influenced by social forces. Prominent American sociologist C. Wright Mills uses the term “sociological imagination” to refer to this ability to see the impact of social forces on individuals, especially on their private lives.

Social innovation may take the form of a policy, a programme, or advocacy that features an untested or unique approach. Innovation usually starts at the community level, but it can grow into a national or international programme. The concept of “partnership housing” was developed by Millard and Linda Fuller in 1965, partnering those in need of adequate shelter with community volunteers to build simple interest-free houses. In India, recent initiative 'Swachh Bharat', 'Digital India', 'Make in India' etc. are also unique social innovations that can transform Indian society in a big way.

HACC HOSTS GU ELLISBRIDGE SOUTH ZONE AND INTER-ZONAL YOUTH FESTIVALS

Gujarat Law Society's HACC is among the rare grant-in-aid colleges to have the privilege of hosting both, the Ellisbridge South Zone and the Inter-Zonal youth festivals of Gujarat University, in the month of September this year. Aptly titled Prajwalan 2018, the tag-line of the

events - "Igniting Talent" - indicated exactly what the Youth Festival is all about.



The Ellisbridge South Zone Youth Festival of Gujarat University was held from 12th to 15th September 2018 at four different venues, namely HACC, Thakorebhai Desai Hall, Senate Hall and the seminar hall of the Zoology Department at GU. With 45 colleges participating in 29

different events, this is the largest zone of Gujarat University, recording a staggering 1500 plus number of participants! What usually would take two or three days to organize all the events, this round of the youth festival took 4 whole days to accommodate all the participating institutions. Noteworthy among these events was the One-Act Play competition which recorded 16 participating colleges, as against about half the number last year.



The inaugural Rally had a host of colleges participating with pomp and show, and with students dressed in various costumes depicting the theme “Unity in Diversity”.

The best three performances of all the events held at the three zones – City Zone, Ellisbridge North Zone and Ellisbridge South Zone - compete at the inter-zonal level which was also organized by HACC. The 29 different competitions were held at the same four venues, and since there were only nine competitors for each event from the three zones of the University, this level of the youth festival covered two days.

The Principal of the college led the organization of the events forward, with coordinators and joint-coordinators. At the Ellisbridge South Zone level, Dr. Mahesh Sonara and Prof. Malti Vala were the coordinators. At the Inter-Zonal level, Dr. Chetan Mewada and Prof. Nikhil Vaidya were the coordinators.

The team spirit of HACC was evident in the way the entire staff and the committed volunteers worked towards organizing these events under the leadership of Principal Dr. Sanjay Vakil.



Productive Partnerships and Fruitful Connections: New Jersey City University, USA, and H.A. College of Commerce, Ahmedabad



The liaison between NJCU and HACC, which began in 2015, has now turned into a strong bond of collaborative partnership. When educational institutions partner with each other in a spirit of friendship and common good, it is certain to turn into a mutually benefiting outcome, bringing advantages to the students, the faculty and the cause of education. NJCU and HACC have experienced this outcome.



On the 5th and 6th of January 2019, Dr. Sue Henderson, President, NJCU, and Ms Tamara Cunningham, Asst. Vice-President, (Global Initiatives), NJCU, visited Gujarat Law Society to meet



with Shri Sudhir Nanavati, Executive Vice-President, GLS, and President, GLS University, and other GLS officials, so as to strengthen the existing ties between the two institutions. The Patel Scholars Program, currently running between the two institutions, is the pilot project funded by HACC alumnus, Mr. Chirag Patel, Co-founder and Co-CEO, Amneal Pharmaceuticals, USA. Under this program, 5 students from Gujarat Law Society's HA College of Commerce are funded every year

to study MBA at the NJCU School of Business, since 2016.

At the luncheon meeting between GLS and NJCU on 5th of January, the two institutions discussed many of the projects running at their respective organizations, opening the path for future alliances and further partnerships.

President Henderson spoke about how India is sure to be the bright spot in the global future and how she has been impressed with the way Indians and India have progressed over the years. She mentioned how proud she is of the diversity of her university, and how she can see a similar diversity in India. She looks forward to many partnerships and programs between GLS and NJCU for the benefit of the students.



Shri Sudhir Nanavati spoke about the growth of GLSU and GLS over the years, hoping for alliances that will strengthen the next generation and the country. He appreciated the efforts of Dr. Sanjay Vakil, Principal, HACC, and the faculty of HACC. There were interactions between the Deans,

Principals and Directors of GLS, with Ms Cunningham regarding international relations between NJCU and GLS.

The ties between HACC and NJCU reached a peak when 14 students and 2 faculty members came for 6 days as guests of the HA Gandhian Society. This visit of the NJCU team of students and faculty to a college in India, with organized homestays for all, in order to experience Gandhi's life and ideals, is one of the most unique events in educational history. The faculty members of the Gandhian Society, Dr. Jean Dsouza, Dr. Anuradha Pagedar, Dr. M.R. Sonara and Prof. Shubhra Nanavaty, also were highly involved with this visit.

The welcome ceremony of these students was filled with fanfare and tradition, with HACC students dressed in sarees, welcoming the guests with garlands and tika. The next six days included visits to Gujarat Vidyapith, Gandhi Ashram, Adalaj ni Vav, Amdavad ni Gufa, Heritage Walk, etc. It also included the celebration of the kite-flying festival together with the host students. On the last day, the college celebrated Traditional Day, wherein all the students of the college dressed in traditional garments, and the visitors too joined in with Indian clothing. All the students and faculty danced to tunes of garba and raas, enjoying the company, the music and the ambiance.



The visiting students were included in the lives of the families of the home-stays organized for them. They enjoyed cooking, eating and sharing lives with the families they lived with. They experienced some of the values and life-style of Gandhi in their home-stays, thus ensuring the


